Tennessee SAVIN is a free service that allows you to anonymously check an offender's custody status by phone, website, or mobile app. You can also register to receive automated notifications about changes in custody status by phone, email, text, or mobile app. TTY service for people with hearing loss is also available.

Tennessee SAVIN Facts

- If you feel you are in danger, call 911 immediately.
- TN SAVIN is confidential. The offender will not know you are registered with this service.
- SAVIN provides information on offenders in custody in Tennessee.
- TN SAVIN calls automatically when an offender's custody status changes. You may get a call from TN SAVIN in the middle of the night.
- Write down your PIN and keep it in a safe place.
 For safety reasons, do not share this information with others.
- If you do not answer a notification call, TN SAVIN will leave a message and will continue calling back, up to 24 hours, or until you enter your PIN.
- Do not register a phone number that rings to a switchboard.
- You can register multiple phone numbers and email addresses for notifications.
- If you forget your PIN, call the toll-free number and press zero. You will be transferred to an operator who can help you reset your PIN, or cancel the notification.
- Operators are available 24/7 to assist you.

Phone Notifications

If registering a phone number, you will be asked to create a four-digit personal identification number (PIN). When TN SAVIN calls, listen to the message. The PIN will be used to confirm that the call was received. Make sure your PIN is easy to remember.
